1:31:18 PM PUBLIC HEARING – Proposed Amendments to the Chelan County Boating Regulation Pertaining to the Use of Motorboats on the Wenatchee River Chairman Hawkins opens the hearing with Commissioner Goehner and the Clerk of the Board in attendance. Commissioner Walter is excused from session to attend the dedication of the new Farm Worker Housing Camp in Malaga.

Mr. Dennis Beich, WDFW Regional Director speaks on the proposed regulation. Mr. Beich initially brought this matter before the Board. He is glad to see this on the agenda and before the Board today. A potential problem of motorized craft on the Wenatchee River was brought before the Board approximately one year ago. The issue that he sees as a potential problem is that over the last ten years they have not had a Spring Chinook Season on the Wenatchee River. The rafting business has picked up dramatically. The white water rafting and the Spring Chinook Fishery will overlap. To avoid complications with the small river and the motorized craft, folks trying to fish, and rafters trying to raft, he and others feel it would be good to place a ban on motorized craft on the Wenatchee River to avoid conflicts that are foreseen. Last year was the first time for Steelhead Season on the Wenatchee and they are pushing to be able to open a Spring Chinook Fishery as well.

Commissioner Hawkins shares the proposed regulation which would eliminate the use of motor boats on the river except for public safety boats such as the Sheriff's boat or boats with electric trolling motors. Mr. Beich is in favor of the proposed regulation.

Commissioner Goehner speaks on the Boating Regulations and that it can be addressed how the fishing is done. He believes this is what happened with the Steelhead fishing and the conflict that could result is that there would be fisherman that would not be able to use motor boats but there could still be motorized water craft on the river. This will provide consistency in enforcement and it would be much easier to enforce the regulation that we have rather than trying to keep it confined to the Fishery itself.

Commissioner Hawkins shares there was some concern expressed to him that the Fish and Wildlife agenda goes beyond just removing motorized boats from the River but also outlawing or removing the legal authority to do other activities in the River. He asks Mr. Beich if he can respond to that comment.

Mr. Beich states he is not sure what the comments or concerns would have been and he states Fish and Wildlife does not have another agenda. He is not sure what the other activities are that would be restricted. Gold panning, mining and dredging are noted as concerns. This regulation would be based solely on the conflict between passive white water boaters and conflicts with speed boats.

Commissioner Goehner states that this has been brought before the Board not only as a request solely of the Department of Fish and Wildlife but private, non profit groups such as Trout Unlimited requested the restriction take place.

1:39:59 PM PUBLIC TESTIMONY:

Mr. Dave Graybill, resident of Leavenworth, speaks as an active angler, a member of Trout Unlimited, Wenatchee Sportsman's Association, Fly Club, and he has discussions with those various groups and discussed the meeting coming up today. He universally got comments 100% in favor of restrictions on the river and the primary concern is safety. They see improved conditions for fishing, recovery of fish in the river, potential for additional seasons, river ethics among the groups, but one of the primary concerns voiced by the members of the groups is safety. To have a powered vehicle navigating the river when there is drift boats and rafters there is concern. There are periods when it would be very difficult to anticipate the approach of a rafter. Another thing that was brought up was erosion. There have been enforcements put in place on other streams that he is aware of that restricted or eliminated motorized craft due to erosion. One concern that is particularly sensitive is the noise from the use of high power boats starting up and navigating the rivers. The people that he has spoken with are in favor of the regulations. He asks about the boundary of the footbridge. Commissioner Goehner explains that this was done to make consistency and point for clarity. The other areas do allow the electric trolling motor so that is why that is left in this also. Mr. Graybill talks about current and navigation issues at the confluence.

Kevin Winters, resident of Leavenworth, states reading over the proposal that he does not have anything in opposition to it specifically but from a practical standpoint of a person who fishes the Icicle, he does see conflicts there (on the Icicle). In his discussions he has heard

other people are concerned also. The issue that he sees with our resolution is the inclusions of electric trolling motors which could be a problem on a 20 foot boat. He sees that some come in with some fairly large craft for that body of water. He has seen some boats in there that has some strong electric motors that are in the 20 foot plus length. It is unnerving when you are sitting on the corner of that river during high current flow and someone comes through there in the dark. You are concerned that they are not going to be able to go past without running in to you. He has had some close encounters up there. He would prefer to see no electric motors up there and on the Icicle as well as a number of people he has talked with and the fishing groups due to safety concerns. In the past that trolling provision was in place for a gentleman that was no longer able to row. That gentleman is no longer with us. Mr. Winters would recommend that you take a look at that one particular body of water. It is not restricted in terms of the proposal you have in front of you. If you look at the history of that particular stream that is fished when you have large boats on it (the Icicle)... He believes that resolution and he is in support of it and it will address some ethical and safety issues. There have been some safety is sues on the body of water and in one case it did involve a lot of alcohol and one person did lose their life. They have made some improvements as to where the fishery actually starts but people who are at the mouth of the river that they have had problems with, have just moved up river. It is a one way fishery when they are fishing in oar boats of any type and everyone is going in the same direction and people are not turning their boats around and going upstream, but if you have people coming down in oar boats, rafts, kayaks or whatever, you have a conflict up with electric motors. It is a problem and he does not feel that any electric motor should be allowed on the Icicle.

Don Enright of Sunnyslope speaks. He did not know there was a problem on the Wenatchee with power boats. He has never seen any power boats so why pass the rule if it may not be a problem. He represents NCW Prospectors Club which dredges on the River and has a motor on a pontoon. The motor does not propel the boat but rather uses it for suction. That boat would not be restricted by the regulation according to Commissioner Hawkins and Commissioner Goehner in their interpretation. The state organization for the prospectors club has had problem with WDFW at the State and he wanted to make sure this was not the beginning of a ban of all boats.

Commissioner Goehner states this also came up at a meeting they had several years ago with many interests represented such as sport fishermen, white water rafters, and the whole gamut of river users were at the meeting. This conflict has been one of the concerns. At that point they did not enact anything. One reason we are here today is because of a result of that discussion.

Mr. Enright explains they do the dredging from Cashmere towards Wenatchee on the river around the Redd Season beginning July 1 and because of runoff you cannot do that until the end of July. Commissioner Goehner states that they do their dredging when the water is low and there is probably not a boat conflict. Mr. Enright shares that he has not seen any power

boats on the lower end of the River. He has seen jet skis as a public safety during the Ridge to River Race.

Oscar Pearson testifies. He shares that most of his questions have been answered. He was interested if this restriction involves the Columbia. That has been cleared in his mind.

Kevin Winters would like to address the questions of Jet Skis and power boats. He has seen Jet Skis and Wave Runners near Cashmere Park during high water where they were hitting the back ramp of a wave to catch air and on occasion they departed from their machine. He could only assume that would be a traffic hazard should there be an oar boat or raft on the other side of that ramp. He has seen power boats and water ski boats being launched in during high water in Leavenworth from the East Leavenworth Road Ramp in the summertime during high water. Mr. Winters was amazed someone would put in an inboard/outboard in that river and head upriver given all the underwater leftovers from the logging industry. There are general safety issues and the general public are not aware of them.
