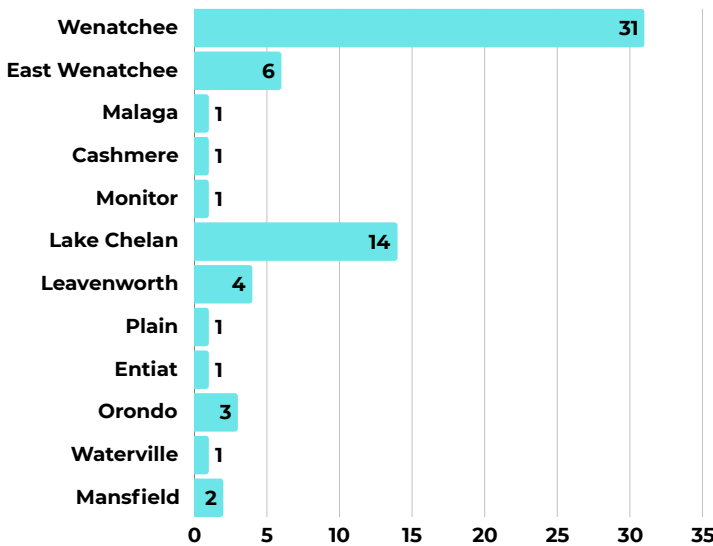

- 16 Refused/Don't Know



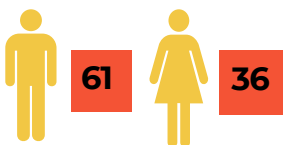
88 people are considered chronically homeless (100 people responded to this question).

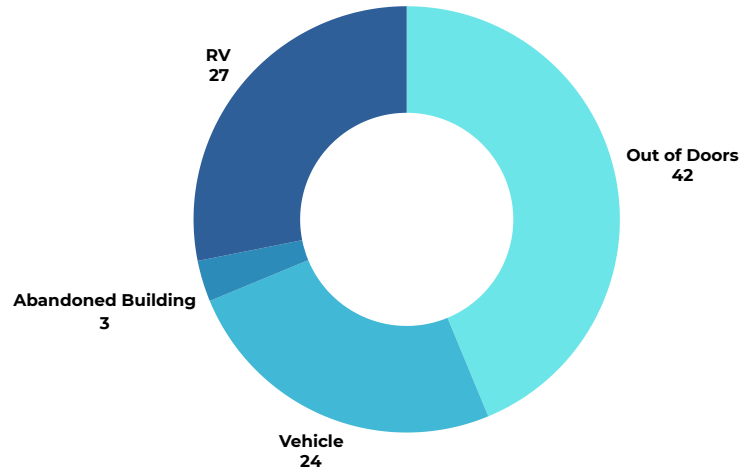

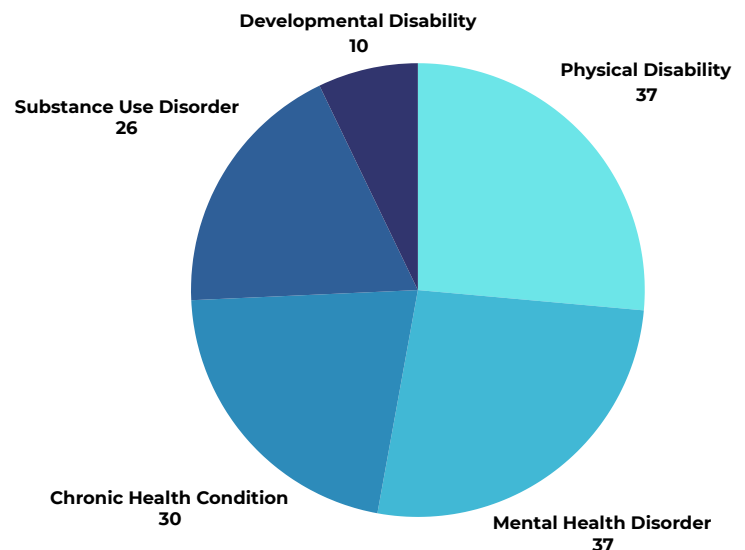

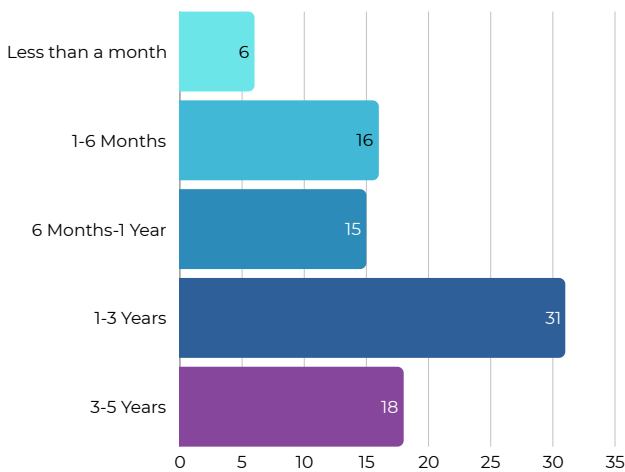
Chelan-Douglas Survey

46 people indicated this was their first time being homeless (119 people responded to this question).

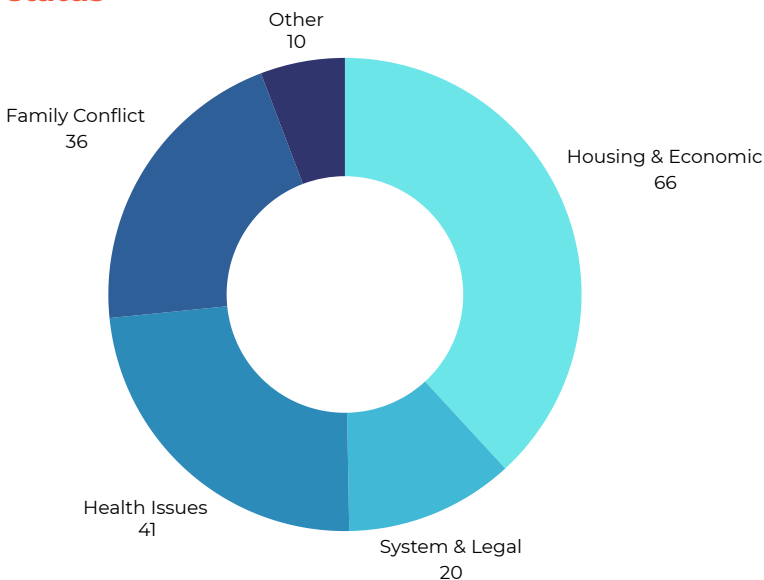
For how long they have been experiencing homelessness this time:



66 people stated they'd be willing to stay at a shelter if there was room; **48** said they would not. Reasons people stated they did not want to go into a shelter included:

Cannot stay w S/O	3
Cannot have pet	7
Shelter charges a fee	1

Overcrowded	4
Feels unsafe	9
Seem dirty or unsanitary	1

73 people indicated no use

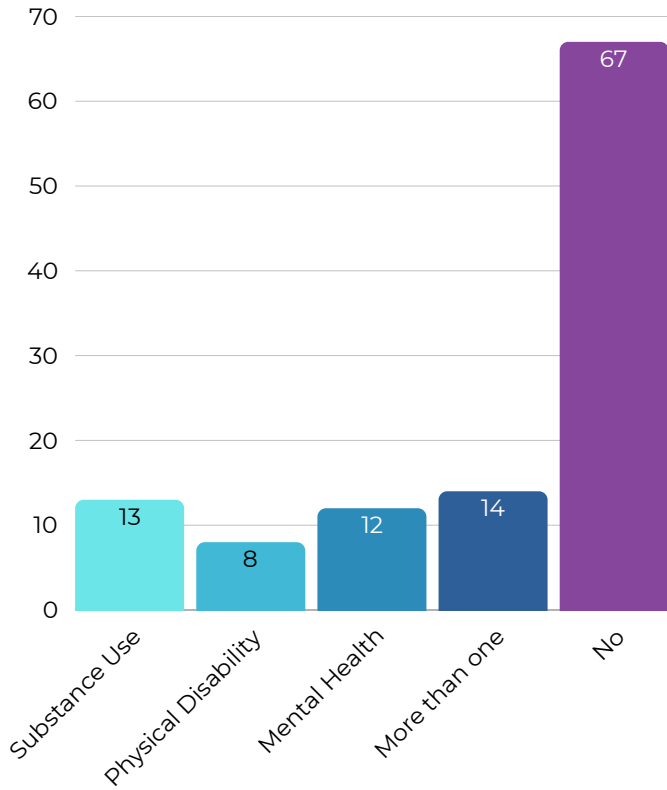

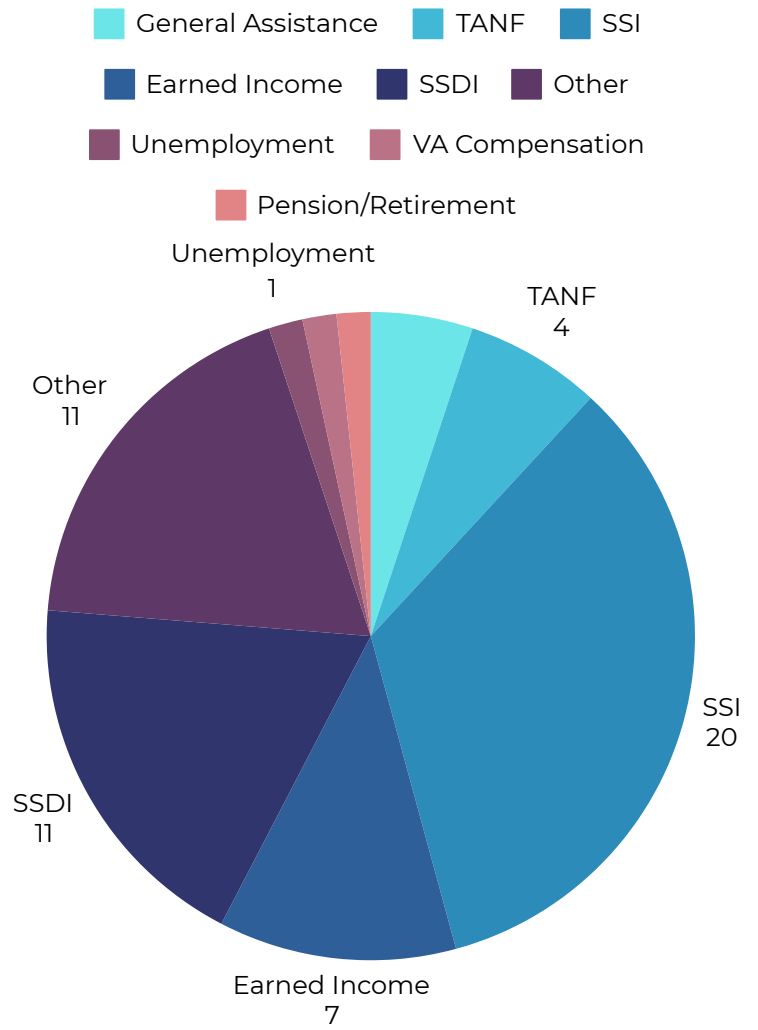

When asked about situations that keep them from living in a stable housing



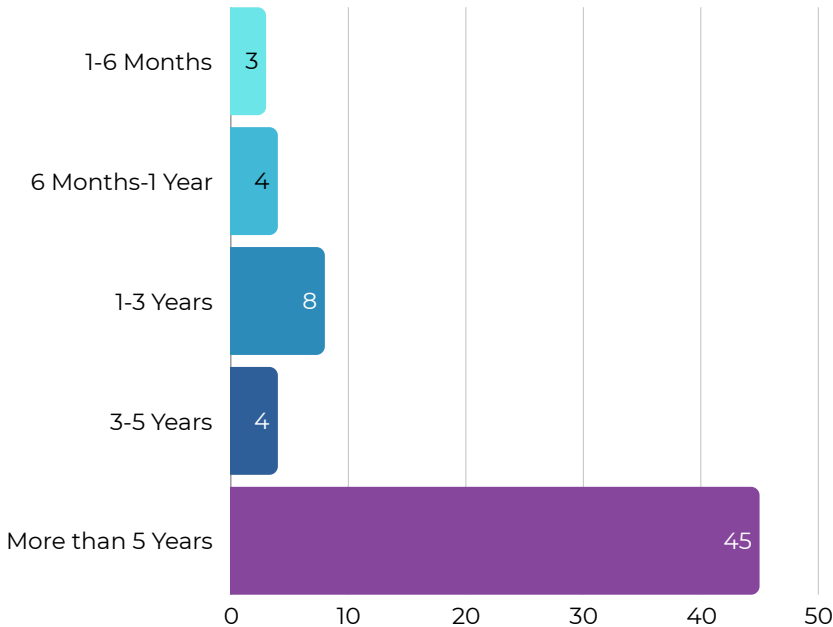

When asked if they were from Chelan or Douglas County

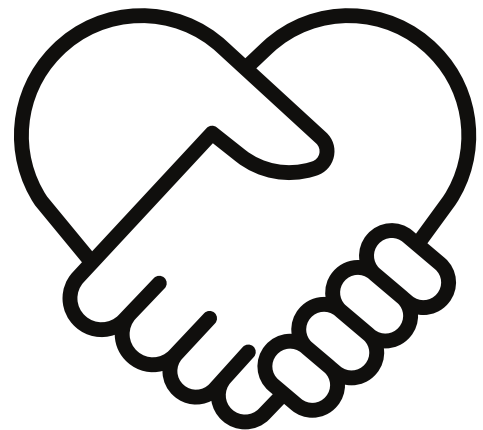
