**Initiative Measure No. 2066**

Initiative Measure No. 2066 concerns regulating energy services, including natural gas and electrification. This measure would repeal or prohibit certain laws and regulations that discourage natural gas use and/or promote electrification, and require certain utilities and local governments to provide natural gas to eligible customers.

**Initiative Measure No. 2109**

Initiative Measure No. 2109 concerns taxes. This measure would repeal an excise tax imposed on the sale or exchange of certain long-term capital assets by individuals who have annual capital gains of over \$250,000. This measure would decrease funding for K-12 education, higher education, school construction, early learning, and childcare.

**Initiative Measure No. 2117**

Initiative Measure No. 2117 concerns carbon tax credit trading. This measure would prohibit state agencies from imposing any type of carbon tax credit trading, and repeal legislation establishing a cap and invest program to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. This measure would decrease funding for investments in transportation, clean air, renewable energy, conservation, and emissions-reduction.

Initiative Measure No. 2124 concerns state long term care insurance. This measure would provide that employees and self-employed people must elect to keep coverage under RCW 50B.04 and could opt-out any time. Sales and Use Tax for Transportation Improvements  
  
The Board of the Transportation Benefit District, Chelan, Washington, adopted Resolution No. 2024T-001 to fund transportation improvements through a sales and use tax. This proposition authorizes a tax no greater than three-tenths of one percent (0.3%) on all taxable retail sales within the District for ten years pursuant to RCW 82.14.0455. Tax proceeds will fund projects identified in the Transportation Improvement Programs informed by the public and adopted by the City of Chelan.

AUTHORIZING REGULAR PROPERTY TAX  
LEVY FOR CAPITAL REPLACEMENT AND

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire Protection District No. 8, Chelan County, Washington, adopted Resolution No. 2024-1 concerning a proposition to continue funding the replacement of CAPITAL EQUIPMENT and the support of VOLUNTEER SERVICES. Under this proposition, a property tax levy of \$0.95 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation would go into effect in 2025.
