# 3. Field Season Progress

Adam Pfleeger gave an update on field season activities, including a new project using drone technology to control myrtle spurge near Ohme Gardens, common crupina control work completed last month near Stehekin, and contracted spraying on whitetop in the Horse Lake area. Adam then summarized the transition to the new contact management system using ArcGIS. Adam also discussed working with WSDOT to get control of high priority weeds. Adam updated on the use of biological control on Dalmatian toadflax in Chelan County. Discussion followed.

#### 4. Education & Outreach

Julie updated on the 2 Earth Day events in April and our first farmers market event of the season, last Saturday in Leavenworth. Julie also discussed her presentation at the Saturday Gardens event presented by the WSU Extension Master Gardeners.

## **BOARD MEMBER ROUNDTABLE**

The Board decided future meetings would be held at 4 pm using a hybrid in-person/online format. Other discussion topics included creating a volunteer group to help control noxious weeds in Chelan County, an app for citizens to report weeds to the CCNWCB, and working with the Douglas County Weed Management Task Force on controlling knotweed in Douglas County. Finally, there was discussion about a Leavenworth landowner who had multiple complaints of noxious weeds growing out of control on his property.
